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Smuggling vs. Trafficking

Smuggling

- Crime against nation
- Must cross international border
- Person free to leave after border passage
- A person consents to be smuggled
- No labor or sexual exploitation required

Trafficking

- Crime against person
- No movement required
- Person is NOT free to leave after border passage
- A person is trafficked through force, fraud, or coercion
- Involves labor or sexual exploitation

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San Diego's Sex-Trafficking Shame

A leopard-print sign hanging on Andrea Smith's front door announces, "I am a luxury few can afford." Three years ago there was heavy truth in that statement. Smith was bringing in about \$2500 a night turning tricks.

"I charged \$500 for a half hour, full service — meaning blow job and sex — and \$1000 for the girlfriend experience. That was the loving, the hugging, the kissing, the affection, and the holding. A lot of people wanted that because they might have a girlfriend or wife at home, but they wanted something [different] with me."

Smith gave up drugs and prostitution after a severe beating handed down by her pimp and his friends landed her in the hospital and caused her to miscarry twin babies. She is now living at a seven-acre women's rehabilitation center in San Diego with her two children, a sixth-month-old and three-year-old. The program provides a free two-bedroom, furnished, apartment for up to a year until Smith gets back on her feet.



Red Flags In Health Care Setting

- Multiple cell phones
- Controlling partner, no separation
- Suspicious injury –
 inconsistent mechanism with hx
- No regular access to health care
- Dental issues, injuries

- Frequent STI's
- No access to personal ID info
- Branding/tattoos
- Expensive clothes or purses
- Drug use
- Not knowing address

Tips For Engaging HT Patients

- Body language
- ▶ Tone
- Separating from others
- Non medical terms
- Use first name, show respect
- Not a rescue
- Know your resources in case of disclosure
- Provide resources that don't endanger

Trauma Informed Questions

- ► Can you tell me about...
 - ► How you got here
 - ► Who is with you today
 - ► The last time you ate
 - ▶ Where do you normally sleep
 - ▶ Do you have your ID with you

- Follow up questions as needed
 - ► Staying away from "Why" and judgment

- I'm concerned
- Is there anything I can do to help you
- Connecting to resources
- Thank you for sharing with me today
- Warm handoff
